Hot Weather Policy

National Quality Standard

Regulation 168(2)(a) Policies and procedures are required in relation to health and safety, including matters relating to sun protection.

At Kindergarten we need to make arrangements in the case of hot weather to reduce the risk of heat illness to young children. To ensure that children attending Rostrevor Kindergarten enjoy a safe and comfortable learning environment, we have adopted a hot weather policy.

If the Bureau of Meteorology forecast the maximum daytime temperature to be 36°C or greater, or extreme humidity, the Preschool will adhere to the Extreme Heat Strategies dictated by the Department of Education and Child Development.

Modifications to the program may include:

- Activities conducted in periods of hot weather are to be undertaken in shaded areas.
- Children will be frequently offered water and drinking water will be accessible at all times.
- Parents are encouraged to pack food in insulated containers with a freezer brick and we will store the food in a cool place.
- Outside play will be limited to the verandah for quiet activities or indoor activities.
- If the temperature is above 36°C in the CAFÉ eating area we will eat our snacks and lunch inside.

If the preschool site has extenuating circumstances (such as no air-conditioning due to breakdown or power blackout) then there may be early dismissal if the forecast is at least 36 degrees Celsius. Staff will remain on duty in case children are unable to be collected and they will be adequately supervised and kept as comfortable as possible.
